This term we have had a number of events and activities to inspire and guide our pupils. The introduction of our Careers Champions has meant that several of the initiatives have been pupil led. A review of this term's activities is being put together by the Champions, we are submitting this review to NCW and are hoping to be awarded the National Careers Week Gold Award.

During National Apprenticeship Week, pupils in Years 10-13 joined the virtual Big Assembly which was hosted live. This introduced the pupils to big companies that offer apprenticeships, and they had the opportunity to hear from young people currently completing apprenticeships. We also had visiting speaker Jasmine Ee, who gave pupils an insight into her Engineering Degree Apprenticeship. This was a great chance for pupils to see the varied apprenticeships available and how best to access these.

In National Careers Week, we had visiting speakers from five different industries; IT, Civil Service, Performing Arts, Finance and Sport. The volunteers delivered insightful talks detailing their own jobs as well as other roles available in the industries and how best to enter the industry. In addition, we worked with local company Grove Pension Solutions and parent volunteers to deliver most of our Year 12 mock interviews. These were gratefully received and gave the pupils great preparation for future job applications, with interviewers commenting on the varied outside interests and excellent interpersonal skills our pupils demonstrate. We hope to build upon the success of this week, next year.

There were many more activities too. The Year 12s attended the UCAS and Apprenticeship Fair in London and had the chance to find out more about the different courses available and how to apply for these. Year 10 Business BTEC pupils and KS3 Enterprise Club are entered into the Tycoon Enterprise Challenge and are developing experience in setting up their own businesses. Year 13 Business BTEC pupils went on work experience and received excellent feedback on their hard working and proactive attitudes. The Careers Champions have delivered assemblies to their peers on how to access Labour Market Information and the importance of researching different career options.

It has been a fantastic term with lots going on and much more to come next term.

Southern Reach, was an amazing story told by Al Sylvester MBE who visited Farringtons and spoke about his adventures to a group of our Highly Able Gifted and Talented students last week.

It was the most moving and inspiring talk about how he lead the RAF's first unsupported attempt on the Geographic South Pole. Al described how he selected and trained his team to survive in tents on Antarctica, while skiing unsupported the 600 nautical miles to the bottom of the earth. A heart on sleeve personal account of the day to day living on the ice, including living on dried food, learning new toilet drills, to skiing in temperatures of -45 degrees, left us with no doubt that Antarctica is one of the most beautiful but most hostile locations in the world.

The key message was mental resilience and determination in the face of uncertainty. All students sat completely gripped listening to the talk and all commented on how 'inspiring' and 'amazing' the talk was.

- 15cl de lait
- 1 Préchauffer le four à 180° C
- 2 Dans une casserole faire fondre le beurre
- 3 Ajouter la farine et mélanger au fouet
- 4 Ajouter le lait petit à petit
- 5 Ajouter le sel et le poivre
- 6 Sur une plaque de cuisson, déposer deux tranches de pain

Ajouter = add Déposer = place Napper = spread Mélanger au fouet = whisk

- 7 Napper avec 50% de la sauce
- 8 Ajouter 50% du fromage râpé
- 9 Ajouter le jambon
