First Aid Policy

1. Introduction

- 1.1 Everyone in the School has access to the Farringtons School Medical Centre which is led by the medical team under the supervision of the Assistant Head Pastoral. They are responsible for any medical care or first aid that children, staff or visitors may require during the school day. When the school is open, they are available to administer first aid, to deal with any accidents or emergencies, or if someone is taken ill. A number of boarding staff are also trained in first aid to ensure sufficient cover when the Health Centre is closed at night.
- 1.2 Medical staff will contact parents promptly in the event of a serious or concerning illness or injury. For less serious conditions they will contact parents either by telephone or email later on the day of the illness or accident. They do not routinely contact parents for minor scrapes like a grazed knee or simple fall in playground.

2. First Aid Notices

2.1 Lists of members of staff who are qualified as First Aiders, and lists of those who have been trained as Appointed Persons, are displayed in departments around the School. The list is also circulated digitally each term. A copy can also be found in (Appendix 1). Staff First Aid training needs updating every three years, although there is training available on an annual basis for First Aiders wanting to refresh specific areas of knowledge that they need.

3. First Aid Boxes

3.1 First aid boxes are placed in all the areas of the School where an accident is considered possible or likely (such as the Sports Hall, or the Science Department) and in the boarding house. Staff always take additional first aid boxes with them when groups of pupils go out of school on organised trips, or to participate in sporting events. All boxes are checked by the members of staff responsible for them at the start of each academic year and, if necessary, replenished. All the School's minibuses carry a first aid box.

4. Access to First Aid

4.1 All new pupils and staff are given information on where to go for help in the event of an accident, as part of their induction at the School.

5. Calling an Ambulance

5.1 If someone at the school has a serious accident, staff are trained to summon medical help immediately. The Medical Centre is normally responsible for summoning an ambulance and for making arrangements for escorting the pupil to hospital; but all staff are advised in their induction training that they should never hesitate to call 999 themselves if the need is urgent. Should a pupil be required to travel urgently to hospital, a member of staff will always stay with them until their parents have arrived and handed over important information. A member of SMT should always be told when an ambulance is required to visit the site for urgent care.

6. Emergency Medical Treatment

In accepting a place at the School, we require parents to authorise the Head, to consent on the advice of an appropriately qualified medical specialist to pupils receiving emergency medical treatment, including general anaesthetic and surgical procedure under the NHS, if we are unable to contact the parents in time.

7. Reporting an Accident

7.1 In the event of significant accident or injury, parents must be informed as soon as practicable. The member of staff in charge at the time will decide how and when this information should be communicated, in consultation with the Medical Centre, and with the SMT if necessary. In certain circumstances the School is legally required under the Reporting of Injuries, Diseases and Dangerous Occurrences Regulations 1995 (RIDDOR) to report accidents to the HSE. This is done by the Medical team in coordination with the Assistant Bursar.

8. Our Medical Care

8.1 The school sends all new parents a medical questionnaire and require it to be completed before their son or daughter joins the School. Reminders are sent throughout the school year.

9. Medical Immunisations

9.1 Parents will be advised if immunisations are to take place within school. Communication will be sent to parents once received by the local authority immunisation team.

10. Medical Records

- 10.1 The school keeps records of all treatment that pupils receive during their time at the School. All accidents and injuries to pupils are recorded in addition to all medicines that are given to them using iSAMS the school's data base.
- 10.2 All medical records will be stored in the Medical Centre by law until a pupil's 25th birthday, when they will be securely destroyed. Access to these records is restricted to the Medical Centre Staff.
- 10.3 The school keeps records of all accidents and injuries, and have a procedure in place for ensuring that they are reviewed regularly in order, where possible to learn how to minimise the likelihood of recurrence.

11. Medicines and Treatments Brought to School for Pupils

- 11.1 Parents are required to advise the Medical Centre Staff of any medication that pupils bring into the school. If a pupil has a medical condition which necessitates regular access to medication, parents must inform the school so that an appropriate routine can be devised. The relevant staff will be informed, in confidence, of any condition that is likely to a pupil in any area of school life. The medical team will work with parents on the completion of a Health Care Plan which sets arrangements that work best for the child (See 11.2 of the Medical Policy).
- 11.2 Parents should be advised that the school needs parental consent for every medicine before staff can administer it.
